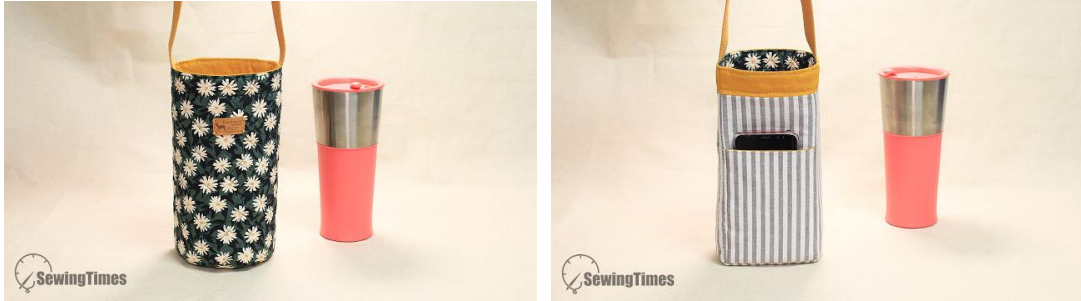


# DIY BOTTLE HOLDER BAG with cell phone pocket

This bottle bag is perfect for carrying bottle or drinks to school, work, and day trips. It has a pocket that can hold a cell phone, also it is a reversible bag, as if you had two bags. I show you in detail so that you can make it easy.



## How to make a Reversible Purse Bag Tutorial [sewingtimes]

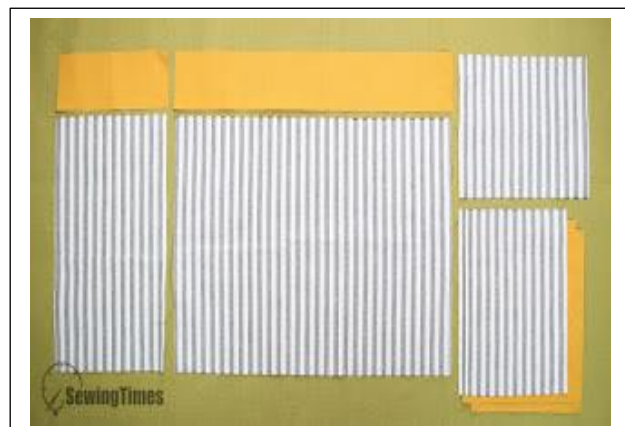
The finished measurements of this pouch are approximately 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"(12cm) W × 9"(22.5cm) H × 4"(10cm)

Let's get started!!



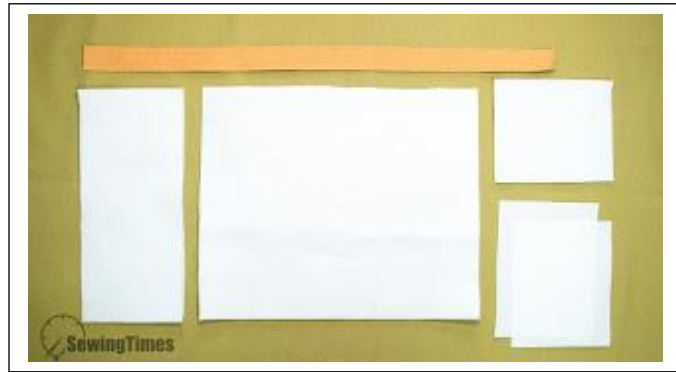
### **Outer layer ( fabric )**

- 1 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"×9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (12cm × 24.5cm)
- 1 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"×9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (29cm × 24.5cm)
- 1 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"×4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (14cm × 12cm)
- 1 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"×5<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (12cm × 15.5cm)



## Lining ( fabric )

- 1  $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{3}{4}''$  (12cm  $\times$  5cm)
- 1  $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{4}''$  (12cm  $\times$  21.5cm)
- 1  $11\frac{1}{4}'' \times 1\frac{3}{4}''$  (29cm  $\times$  5cm)
- 1  $11\frac{1}{4}'' \times 8\frac{1}{4}''$  (29cm  $\times$  21.5cm)
- 1  $5\frac{1}{4}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$  (14cm  $\times$  12cm)
- 3  $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 5\frac{7}{8}''$  (12cm  $\times$  15.5cm)



## Interfacing -- INSULBRITE

- 4"  $\times$  9" (10cm  $\times$  22.5cm)
- $10\frac{3}{4}'' \times 9''$  (27cm  $\times$  22.5cm)
- $4\frac{3}{4}'' \times 4''$  (12cm  $\times$  10cm)
- 4"  $\times$   $5\frac{3}{8}''$  (10cm  $\times$  13.5cm)

Webbing strap

- 1 18" (45.5cm)





To make A DOUBLE bag, all you need is cotton fabric, cut in the following sizes:

- Outside - 12 1/2 x 23 1/2"
- Straps - 2 1/2 x 21" (two)
- Lining - 12 1/2 x 23 1/2" INSULBRITE

Stitch the two 12 1/2" sides right sides together on the outside piece. Press the seam open. Center the seam and press the sides. Turn the top edge under 1/2" and press. Stitch across the bottom. Flatten the bottom corners so the stitching and the crease on the side are lined up. Stitch across the corner, 2" from the tip. Repeat on the other corner.

Repeat all steps with the lining.

Fold the 21" strips right sides together and stitch down the long side. Turn right side out and press with the seam centered.

Turn the outer bag right side out. Leave the lining so the right side is in, and the wrong side is facing out. Stuff it inside the bag, so the two wrong sides are together. Line up the upper edges and pin.

Slip the ends of the handles in between the layers, 2 1/2" from each side of the bag, with the end into the bag about an inch.

Stitch around near the top edge of the bag, and again about 1/2" from the edge.

Lay the bag out flat and find the center. Draw a line with chalk 6" long from the top edge.

Stitch along that line. Be sure to back stitch well at the beginning and end.
